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### About Our School

The Lexington School District is located in and around a small rural community situated along Interstate 55 north of the twin cities of Bloomington and Normal. The city of Lexington has a population of approximately 2100 people. The school district is a unit district that encompasses 83 square miles around and including the city of Lexington. Most of the land use is agricultural with portions used for public or commercial business.

Approximately 510 students in grades PreK-12 are housed at one campus located in Lexington.

The district employs 41 full time teachers and 2 administrators. District program initiatives include an outstanding Pre-school "At-Risk" program and excellent integration of technology into the curriculum beginning in Kindergarten. High school students are able to supplement their coursework with Heartland Community College courses offered during the school day on our campus. Also, students may attend the Bloomington Area Career Center for courses as well. Student attendance rate is over 96% in the district.

### Curriculum

Lexington CUSD offers a comprehensive curriculum including Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, College-Prep, and technical career classes in agriculture, business, computer programming, driver education, English, fine arts, foreign language, health, industrial technology, math, physical education, science, and social studies.

There are eight classes per day, each 45 minutes long. On average, Lexington CUSD core class size is 16 students. Lexington CUSD is part of the Heart of Illinois Conference.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A one-half credit (.5) is earned each semester of enrollment in a course with a passing grade of a D or above. Students are required to be enrolled in seven courses a semester. In order to receive a diploma from Lexington High School, students must complete 25 credits.
